

Apostille in the countries of the CIS

Do you need an apostille or legalisation if a document birth certificate marriage diploma, etc. required to provide one of the CIS if the document is received in one of the countries of the CIS According to the Minsk Convention signed on 22 January 1993, the documents provided from one CIS to another do not need an apostille or legalization. The only requirement for the documents, they must be issued in the country of the CIS and not in the Soviet Union. That is, the document must be a new sample. Another requirement for the diplomas and certificates. They are accepted only after the nostrification procedure. That is, the diplomas and certificates must be confirmed by the relevant ministries before they are provided in one of the countries of the CIS. Very often officials mistakenly believe that if the country is included in the Hague Convention on the apostille the apostille is required. Some officials don't know anything about the Minsk Convention on legal assistance and legal relations in civil family and criminal cases.
